## Volunteer Roles & Requirements

**Benefits of being a Volunteer:**

- Receive accreditation to attend the curling draws when you are not working
- Watch some of the best 24 male and female curling teams in the world compete

**All Volunteers Will:**

- Commit to minimum of 18 hours in order to receive free jacket (volunteers unable to provide 18 hours will be required to purchase an event jacket for \$29.99 +HST)
- Arrive promptly for assigned shift, neatly attired according to dress code (Volunteer Jacket and black pants), wearing volunteer Identification
- Contact responsible Director if unable to make shift as soon as possible
- Be able/willing to switch shifts in the event of gaps/emergencies
- Act as an Ambassador of Curling and the Kingston Community by maintaining friendly, positive attitude to all present at the event.
